

The world venerates the heroes of that strife, and the voice of Despotism durst not calumniate their memory, so sacredly is it enshrined in the heart of every aspirant for Freedom; and when the names of long lines of kings shall fade away in the light of just appreciation, that of Washington and his compatriots will shine with

superior lustre - for their characters were precious gifts from Heaven to man. Such is the theme and such the characters for contemplation, herewith presented to the Youth of our country, as incentives to patriotic action, and as ensamples for imitation. Faithfully should the story of the Revolution be written; faithfully should the artists pencil portray its scenes; and liberality should characterize the dissemination of those labors. Having experienced the skill of Mr. Lossing (of the firm of Lossing & Barritt, engravers) in the illustration of Dowlings History of Romanism, and other works, and having full confidence in his ability as a writer, I have intrusted to him both the authorship of this volume and its pictorial embellishment.
