The Tanosy in these parts are emigrants from the neighbourhood of Fort Dauphin, who were compelled to leave that district because they could not find sufficient rice grounds for themselves and the soldiers comprising the Hova garrison. If I remember rightly, they emigrated to this neighbourhood about thirty years ago. The extent of their territory is small, their towns being twelve in number, and are on the banks of the Teheza, the Onilahy, at the junction of the Sak6ndry with the Onilahy, or, as in the case of Fanafaka and the adjacent hamlets, on the plain between the Teheza and the Sakbndry. Eadodo is the chief king, and there are nine other kings dependent upon him. These kings go under the name of Zafindramanla, and Zafitaomanana. The people say that they were originally 20,000 fighting men from Andsy; this would make the population at least 100,000, but I feel sure that that is too large an estimate. The population cannot, I should think, be more than 20,000, and probably not more than 15,000. They took all their towns from the Bara, whom they drove north. They are accounted good spearmen, and I several times heard them refer to the fact that no Bara tribe could long withstand them. The men and women are very industrious, and are engaged from morning until night in digging, planting, or reaping, etc. Nearly every woman can weave, and they make their garments of cotton, silk, and hemp grown in their own country. Some of the men can carve creditably (vide Chapter v.) and a few can work imperfectly in iron; while the carpentering displayed in some of the houses is almost equal to that of the Betsileo. They can be hired to do any kind

of work, and at cheap rates. Although they possess many charms, and carry a few beads and rings ...
