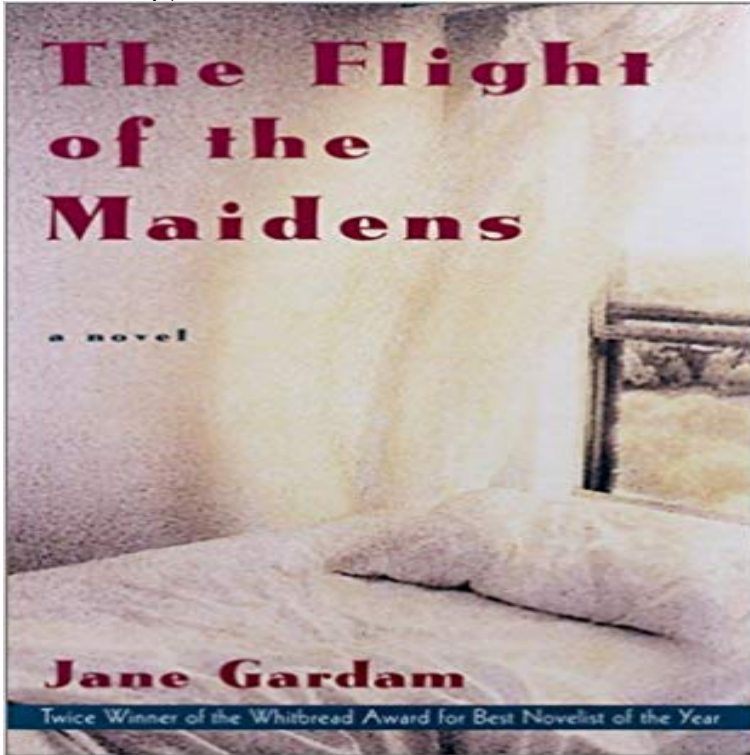


The Flight of the Maidens: A Novel
