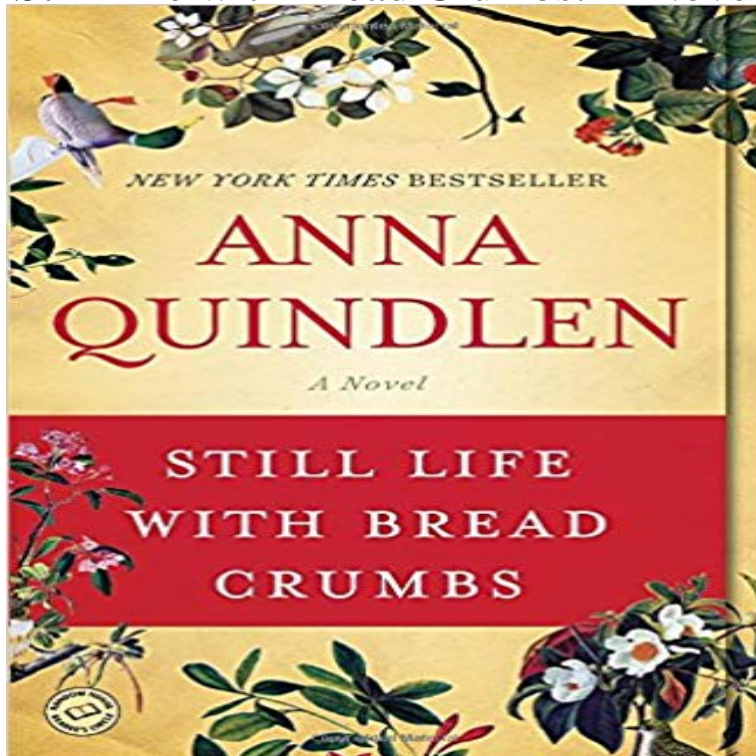


Still Life with Bread Crumbs: A Novel
